ECU Health's HomeGrown supports first-time degree seekers

If you are a current team member who is considering pursuing a first-time degree while continuing to work at ECU Health, consider the ECU Health HomeGrown program.

What is HomeGrown?

HomeGrown is a program that supports life-work balance for eligible team members seeking to complete one of the following degrees for the first time, while continuing to work at ECU Health:

- Associate degree in nursing (ADN)
- Last two years of Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN)
- First three years of the RIBN Program
- Associate degree in Surgical Technology
- Associate degree in Medical Laboratory Technology
- Associate degree in Respiratory Therapy

How does HomeGrown specifically support life-work balance?

- HomeGrown is a program that supports a life-work balance for eligible team members who desire to complete their degree while continuing to work for ECU Health, and who have proven to excel as a student and team member.
- This competitive program allows a team member to work part-time while being paid fulltime and maintaining full-time benefits.
- HomeGrown program recipients are provided a stipend in an amount equivalent to the recipient's compensation for hours actually worked up to twenty (20) hours per week/ forty (40) hours per pay period.

Who is eligible to apply to HomeGrown?

The HomeGrown program supports first-time degree seekers in the programs listed above. HomeGrown does not support a progression of the nursing degree (ADN to BSN). HomeGrown candidates must be:

- Current, full-time ECU Health team members with at least six months of full-time continuous service
- High school graduate or equivalent with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 out of a possible 4.0 points
- Accepted into an accredited traditional associate or bachelor's degree program that requires less than two years to complete with the exception of RIBN
- Eligible to participate in clinical rotations if required for degree completion
- Supported by a minimum of two letters of recommendation from their immediate supervisor, department manager or administrator
- Seeking a **first-time** degree (not the progression of the nursing degree) in an approved program (listed above)

How many slots are available?

HomeGrown is a competitive program and has a limited number of slots. Meeting eligibility criteria only secures the application being accepted for review and does not guarantee

acceptance into the program.

I'm under current disciplinary action. Am I eligible to apply for a slot in HomeGrown?

Team members under current disciplinary action are not eligible to participate in the HomeGrown program.

Who do I contact for more information if I meet the eligibility requirements?

If you meet all eligibility requirements, please email Lisa Lassiter (**llassite@ecuhealth.org**) for an application and provide the following information:

- 1. School you will be attending for the degree
- 2. Degree you are seeking
- 3. Anticipated start date in the program

What is included in the application process?

- 1. Application (include your essay)
- 2. Transcript (please include transcripts from all schools you attended post high school; transcripts can be unofficial but cannot be copied/pasted and must show all required information)
- 3. Acceptance letter to school (if not received, please attach letter of when you expect to be accepted)
- 4. Two reference letters (please include one from immediate supervisor, department manager or administrator)
